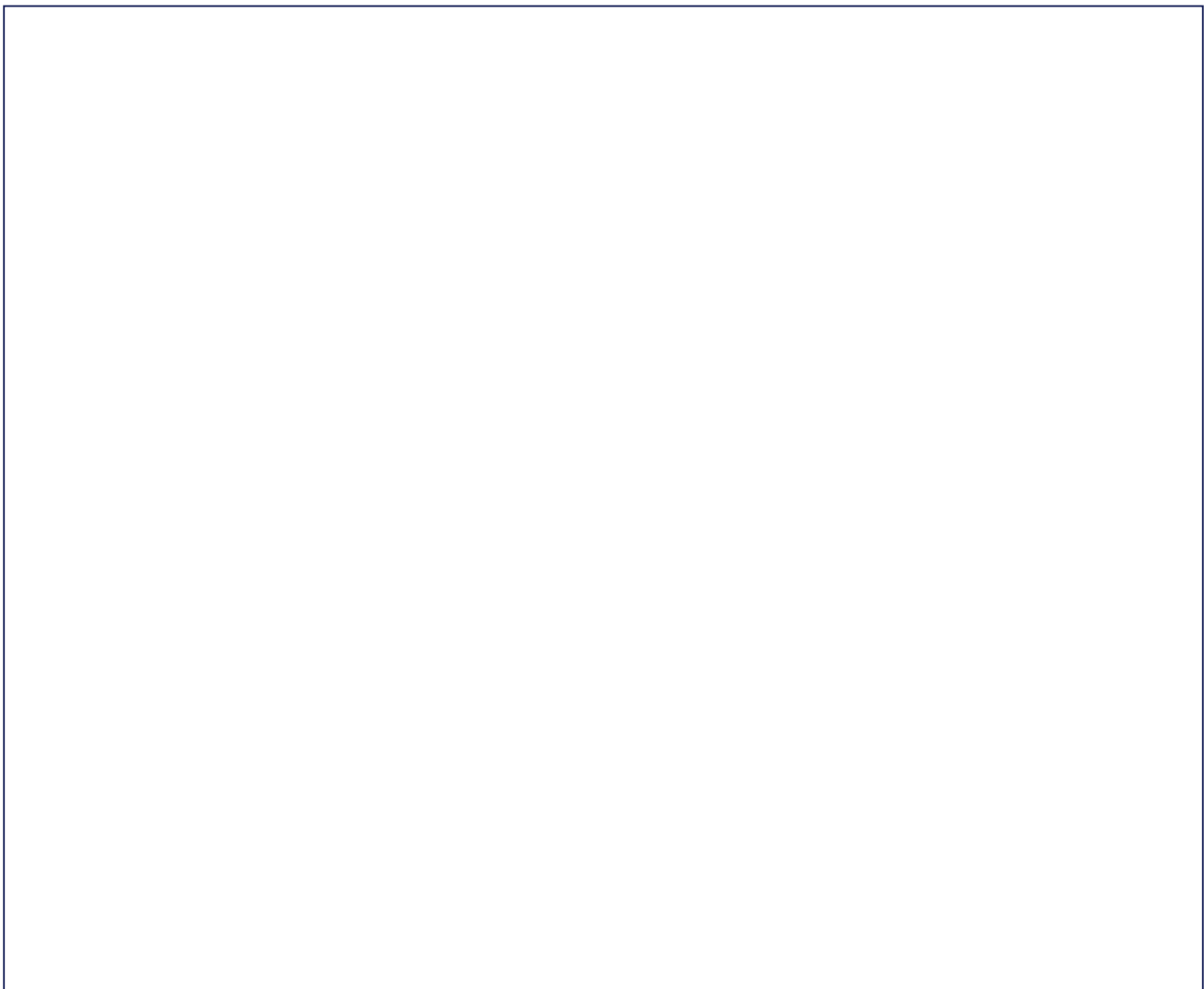


Kit's Internet Safety Guide

Learning objective: To identify ways to stay safe online, including how to protect personal information and respond to online risks.

Follow the drawing prompt below to create your own Digital Safety Poster. Use the word bank to label your diagram and help Kit the fox teach others how to stay safe while browsing.

Draw: Draw a large, friendly scene featuring Kit the fox sitting at a computer desk. In the background, draw a 'Safety Checklist' board. Include a shield symbol to represent data protection, a 'Stop' sign to represent reporting, and a smiling adult figure to represent a trusted person. Use bright colours and clear, bold labels from the word bank to make the poster easy to read for other students.



Label words: Private Information · Strong Password · Trusted Adult · Report · Block · Unkind Messages

Steps:

1. Why should you never share your home address or school name with someone you meet online? Explain using a full sentence.
2. Step 1: Draw a 'Shield' icon on your poster. Label it with the types of information that should always be kept private.
3. Step 2: Draw a speech bubble coming from Kit the fox. Write a short sentence explaining what you should

do if you see something online that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.

4. List three features of a 'Strong Password' that helps keep your online accounts safe from others.

5. Step 3: Draw a 'Stop' sign on your poster. Label it with the action you would take if someone sent you an unkind message.
