Connect the Dots: How the Digital World Talks!

- A network is a group of two or more computers connected together so they can share information, like files or photos.
- A router acts like a digital post office; it decides where data needs to go and makes sure it arrives at the right device.
- Wireless networks use invisible radio signals to send data through the air, while wired networks use physical cables to connect devices.
- A server is a powerful computer that stores data and 'serves' it to other computers on the network when they ask for it.
- Networks allow us to use shared resources, such as sending a document from a laptop to a printer in another room.
