

Apostrophes in Action

Learning objective: To understand and use apostrophes correctly in writing.

Use this template to learn about the correct use of apostrophes. Write a sentence using apostrophes and then answer the questions. Draw a picture that shows how apostrophes are used in sentences.

Apostrophes are small marks used in writing. They can be used to show two things: contractions and possession. A contraction is when two words are joined together, like 'can not' becoming 'can't'. Possession is when something belongs to someone, like 'Alice's book'. Apostrophes are never used to make something plural.

3. Why are apostrophes never used to make something plural? Write your answer in a sentence: (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Create your own example of a contraction and a possessive noun, and explain how the apostrophe is used in each case.
