

Bonfire Night Comprehension

Learning objective: To read and understand a short passage about Bonfire Night, using evidence from the text to answer questions.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow. Choose the correct answer for each question.

It was a chilly autumn evening and the sky was darkening. The smell of bonfires wafted through the air as Emma and her friends made their way to the village green. They had been waiting for weeks for Bonfire Night, and finally the night had arrived. The villagers had set up a large bonfire in the centre of the green, surrounded by fireworks and giant effigies of Guy Fawkes. Emma loved the excitement of Bonfire Night, and the treat of sparkling fireworks and hot dogs. As she walked closer to the fire, she remembered the story of how Guy Fawkes tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament with gunpowder, but was caught in the act and foiled by a group of brave men. The villagers cheered and clapped as the fireworks exploded in the sky, and Emma felt grateful for the bravery of those who had saved the day.

4. What does the smell of bonfires remind Emma of? (1 mark)

5. Do you think Bonfire Night is an exciting event? Why or why not? (3 marks)
