Learning objective: To identify and use similes, metaphors, and personification to add description to writing.

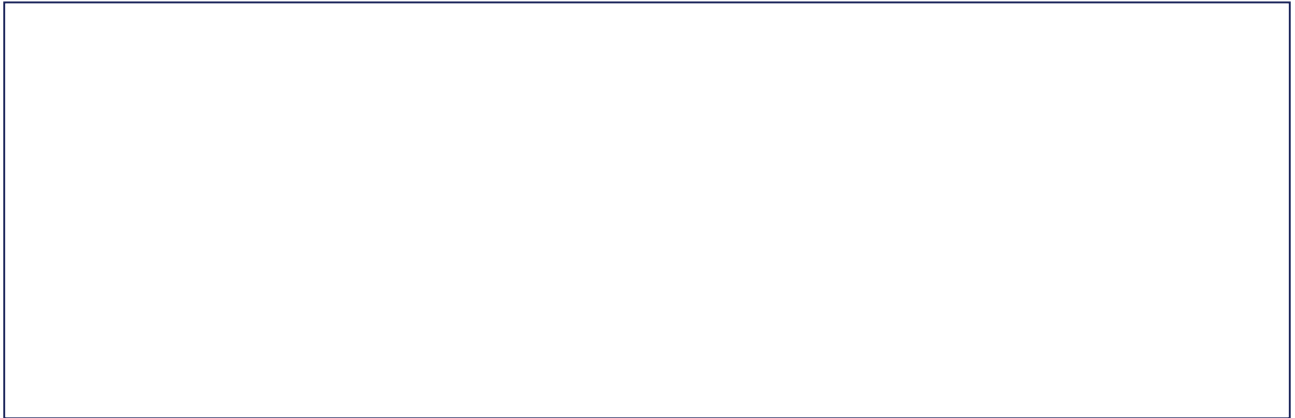
