

Nouns and Verbs with Max and Pip

Learning objective: To identify and distinguish between nouns (people, places, things) and verbs (action or state of being words).

Read the front of the flashcard first. Try to answer the question or define the term before flipping the card to check if you are correct!

What is a Noun?

Noun: A word that names a person, place, thing, or animal.

What is a Verb?

Verb: A word that describes an action, an occurrence, or a state of being.

What is a Proper Noun?

Proper Noun: A specific name for a particular person, place, or organisation, which always starts with a capital letter.

What is a Common Noun?

Common Noun: A general name for a person, place, or thing (e.g., 'chair', 'city', 'dog').

In the sentence 'Max jumps over the log', which word is the verb?

jumps

In the sentence 'Pip reads a colourful book', which words are the nouns?

Pip and book

Is 'London' a common noun or a proper noun?

Proper noun

Can a verb be something you cannot see, like 'think' or 'believe'?

Yes, these are called stative verbs.

Identify the noun and the verb in this phrase: 'The dolphin swims'.

Noun: dolphin; Verb: swims

Which of these is a verb: 'Apple', 'Happy', or 'Run'?

Run

Which of these is a noun: 'Sprinting', 'Library', or 'Quickly'?

Library

Change the verb in this sentence to make it more exciting: 'The lion walked'.

Any strong verb like 'prowled', 'stomped', or 'marched'.
