2. What is the main purpose of a report? (1 mark)

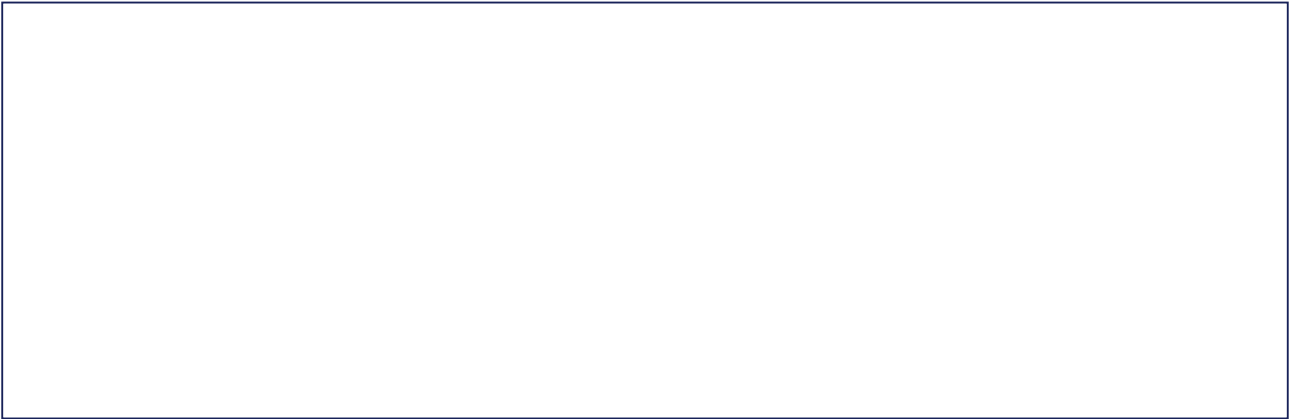
3. What is a typical structure for a report? (2 marks)
