

Year 4 Vocabulary Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of synonyms, antonyms, prefixes, suffixes, and the use of descriptive adjectives and adverbs to enhance writing.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided. Try to use your best spelling and punctuation.

2. Look at the word 'cautiously' in the passage. Which word from the word bank is a synonym (means the same) for 'cautiously'? (1 mark)

3. The word 'unhappy' uses a prefix. What does the prefix 'un-' mean, and can you give another example of a word starting with 'un-'? (2 marks)

4. Write the antonym (opposite) for these two words:

1. Ancient: _____

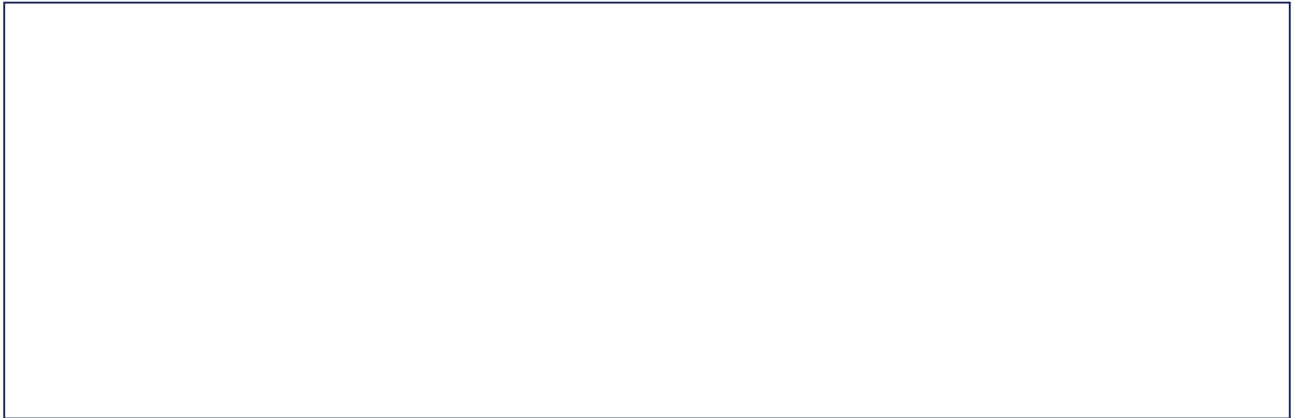
2. Swiftly: _____ (2 marks)

7. Writing Task: Imagine Max the monkey has found a treasure chest. Write a short paragraph (3-5 sentences) describing the chest and how Max opens it. You must use at least two powerful adjectives and one adverb to show your vocabulary skills. (6 marks)
