

## Rosa's French Wardrobe: Les Vêtements

Get ready to dress to impress! Join Rosa the parrot as we explore the world of French fashion.

- When you want to tell someone what you are wearing in French, you start your sentence with 'Je porte'.
- The French word for trousers is 'un pantalon'. Remember, in French, we often use 'un' or 'une' to describe if an item is masculine or feminine.
- If you are wearing a jumper today, you would say 'Je porte un pull'.
- When talking about shoes, we use 'des chaussures' because there are two of them, making the word plural.
- A cap, which keeps the sun out of your eyes, is called 'une casquette' in French.

*Did you know? Did you know? In France, fashion is a huge part of the culture! The word 'prêt-à-porter' is used all over the world, which literally means 'ready to wear'. It refers to high-quality clothes that are sold in standard sizes rather than being custom-made.*
