

French Assessment: Les Jours de la Semaine (The Days of the Week)

Learning objective: To recall, identify, and sequence the days of the week in French and use them in simple sentences.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in the spaces provided. Remember that in French, days of the week do not start with a capital letter unless they are at the start of a sentence.

Rosa the parrot is busy organising her diary for the week. She loves to chirp out her schedule to her friends in the forest. She always starts her week on a Monday!

1. Write the French words for the following days in the correct order, starting with Monday: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday. (3 marks)

2. Translate these two days into English: 'samedi' and 'dimanche'. (2 marks)

3. If today is 'lundi', what is the day after? Write your answer in French. (2 marks)

4. Rosa says, 'Jeudi, c'est mon jour préféré!' Translate this sentence into English. (3 marks)

5. Fill in the blanks to complete the sequence: lundi, mardi, _____, jeudi, _____, samedi, dimanche. (2 marks)

6. Rosa wants to explain her week to her friends. Write a short paragraph in French (using 3-4 sentences) explaining what day it is today, what day it was yesterday, and what day it will be tomorrow (e.g., 'Aujourd'hui c'est...'). (8 marks)

7. Explain why it is important to learn the days of the week in a different language. How could this help you when travelling or visiting other countries? (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a colourful calendar for Rosa the parrot. Label each of the seven days in French and draw a small picture next to each day showing an activity Rosa might do, such as flying, eating fruit, or reading a book.
