

Ma Famille - My Family in French

Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary to describe family members, including possessive adjectives like 'mon', 'ma', and 'mes'.

Read the clues and use the word bank to complete the sentences. Remember to look at the gender and number of the nouns to choose the correct word (mon, ma, or mes).

Word bank: mon père · ma mère · mon frère · ma sœur · mon grand-père · ma grand-mère · mes parents · ma famille

1. Rosa the parrot is introducing her family. Translate 'My mother' and 'My father' into French using the correct words from the bank. (2 marks)

2. If you have a brother, you say 'mon frère'. If you have a sister, you say 'ma sœur'. Why do we use 'mon' for brother but 'ma' for sister? (2 marks)

3. Complete this sentence: 'Voici _____' (This is my family). (1 mark)

4. If you want to say 'my parents' (plural), which word from the bank should you use, and why does it change from 'mon' or 'ma'? (2 marks)

5. Write a French sentence to introduce your grandfather, using 'mon'. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of your family or a group of friends. Label at least three people in your drawing using the French words from the word bank, such as 'mon frère' or 'ma mère'.



Extension challenge: Try to write three sentences about your family in French, adding their names. For example: 'Mon frère s'appelle Tom.'
