

Rosa's French Market Adventure

Learning objective: To recall and use French numbers from 0 to 20 accurately in a shopping context.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a French market to buy fruit for her friends. Read the shopping list below. Each item has a price and a quantity written in French. Your task is to translate the French numbers into English words, calculate the total cost for each item in Australian dollars and cents, and help Rosa record the shopping list correctly.

Word bank: un (1) · deux (2) · trois (3) · quatre (4) · cinq (5) · six (6) · sept (7) · huit (8) · neuf (9) · dix (10) · onze (11) · douze (12) · treize (13) · quatorze (14) · quinze (15) · seize (16) · dix-sept (17) · dix-huit (18) · dix-neuf (19) · vingt (20)

1. Rosa wants to buy 'cinq' apples. Each apple costs £0.20. Write the number 'cinq' in English and calculate the total price. (2 marks)

2. Rosa buys 'dix' oranges. Each orange costs £0.15. Write the number 'dix' in English and calculate the total price. (2 marks)

3. Rosa buys 'huit' bananas. Each banana costs £0.25. Write the number 'huit' in English and calculate the total price. (2 marks)

4. Rosa buys 'douze' pears. Each pear costs £0.30. Write the number 'douze' in English and calculate the total price. (2 marks)

5. Rosa buys 'seize' plums. Each plum costs £0.10. Write the number 'seize' in English and calculate the total price. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw Rosa the parrot carrying a woven basket filled with the fruit she bought at the market. Label each type of fruit with the French word for the quantity she purchased (e.g., write 'cinq' next to the five apples).



Extension challenge: If Rosa had a £10.00 note, calculate the total cost of all the fruit combined and work out how much change she would receive from the market stall holder.
