

Rosa's French Number Challenge

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of French numbers 1 to 20 and apply them to simple calculations and real-world scenarios.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot has provided a word bank to help you. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local market in France. She is helping the stallholders count their items and calculate the prices for their customers. Help Rosa complete the tasks below.

Word bank: un · deux · trois · quatre · cinq · six · sept · huit · neuf · dix · onze · douze · treize · quatorze · quinze · seize · dix-sept · dix-huit · dix-neuf · vingt

1. Write the French words for the following numbers: a) 4, b) 12, c) 16, d) 20. (4 marks)

2. Rosa sees 7 red apples and 6 green apples. How many apples are there in total? Write the number in words in French. (2 marks)

3. If a pencil costs 5p (cinq pence) and you buy 3, how much is the total? Write the calculation and the final answer in French words. (4 marks)

4. Explain why it is important to learn French numbers when visiting a market in France. Give two reasons. (4 marks)

5. Rosa is counting coins. She has 18 gold coins and gives 9 away to a friend. How many does she have left? Write the answer in French words and explain your working out. (6 marks)

6. Creative Writing: Rosa is at a bakery. She wants to buy 15 croissants for her friends. Write a short sentence in French describing how many croissants she is buying. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket containing a number of items (between 11 and 20) and write the French word for that quantity underneath your drawing.
