

Rosa's French Number Challenge

Learning objective: To read, write, and use French numbers from 1 to 20 accurately within a Year 4 context.

Help Rosa the parrot solve these number puzzles! Read each question carefully and write your answers in French using the word bank provided.

Word bank: un · deux · trois · quatre · cinq · six · sept · huit · neuf · dix · onze · douze · treize · quatorze · quinze · seize · dix-sept · dix-huit · dix-neuf · vingt

1. Max the monkey has 5 bananas and receives 3 more. How many bananas does he have in total? Write the number in French. (2 marks)

2. Write the French words for the following numbers: 7, 12, and 19. (3 marks)

3. Solve this number sequence: un, deux, trois, _____, cinq. What is the missing number in French? (1 mark)

4. If a notebook costs £10 (dix) and a pen costs £6 (six), what is the total cost in French? (e.g., 'The total is [number] pounds') (2 marks)

5. Translate this sentence into English: 'J'ai seize ans.' (Hint: 'J'ai' means 'I have' or 'I am'). (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket containing 'quinze' (15) apples and label the basket with the word 'quinze' in a colourful bubble.



Extension challenge: Can you write a French number sentence for the sum of $10 + 5 = 15$ using the French words for each number?
