

French Shopping Assessment: Rosa the Parrot's Market Visit

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of French vocabulary relating to shopping, prices, and polite transactions.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers in the spaces provided. Remember to use French vocabulary where required and include the £ symbol for any currency questions.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a local French market. She wants to buy some fruit and a treat for her friends. She uses polite phrases to ask for prices and says 'Merci' when she completes her shopping.

Word bank: S'il vous plaît (Please) · Merci (Thank you) · Combien ça coûte ? (How much does it cost?) · Je voudrais (I would like) · La pomme (The apple) · Le pain (The bread) · Le chocolat (The chocolate) · C'est trop cher (It is too expensive)

1. Rosa wants to buy an apple. Write the French phrase for 'I would like an apple'. (2 marks)

2. If Rosa asks 'Combien ça coûte ?', what is she asking in English? (2 marks)

3. Translate these items into French: The bread and The chocolate. (2 marks)

4. Rosa sees a bar of chocolate that costs £2.50. Write this price in French words. (3 marks)

5. Why is it important to use 'S'il vous plaît' when shopping in France? Explain your answer. (4 marks)

6. Rosa sees an item she thinks is too expensive. Write the French phrase she would use to say this. (2 marks)

7. Imagine you are at the market with Rosa. Write a short dialogue (5 sentences) between you and a shopkeeper. You must include a greeting, an item you want to buy, a question about the price, and a polite 'thank you'. (5 marks)

8. Rosa buys three apples costing 50p each. Calculate the total cost in Australian dollars and cents and write it in a full sentence in French. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot at a French market stall. Label at least three items on the stall using their French names.
