

La Météo avec Rosa: Weather in French

Join Rosa the parrot and discover how to talk about the weather in French!

- To say it is sunny, we say: Il y a du soleil.
- When the temperature drops and it is cold, we say: Il fait froid.
- If you see raindrops falling from the clouds, you say: Il pleut.
- On a lovely, bright day, you can tell your friends: Il fait beau.
- When the trees are swaying in a breeze, you say: Il y a du vent.
- If you see snowflakes falling, the correct phrase is: Il neige.

Did you know? Did you know? In France, when we talk about the weather, we often use the phrase 'Il fait...' which literally means 'It makes...'. So, when we say 'Il fait chaud', we are saying the weather is 'making' heat!
