

Exploring Earth's Biomes with Finn!

Dive into the different regions of our planet and discover where plants and animals live!

- A biome is a large area of the Earth's surface that has a similar climate and specific types of plants and animals.
- Tropical Rainforests are hot and humid with heavy rainfall, allowing thick jungles and colourful birds to thrive.
- Deserts are very dry biomes where plants, like cacti, have special adaptations to store water for a long time.
- Tundras are the coldest biomes, located near the North and South Poles, where few trees can grow.
- Grasslands are open areas dominated by grasses rather than large forests, often home to grazing animals.
- Climate refers to the average weather patterns of a place over a long period of time, which decides which biome exists there.

Did you know? Did you know? Some biomes are so cold that the ground stays frozen all year round! This is called permafrost, and it is commonly found in the Tundra biome.
