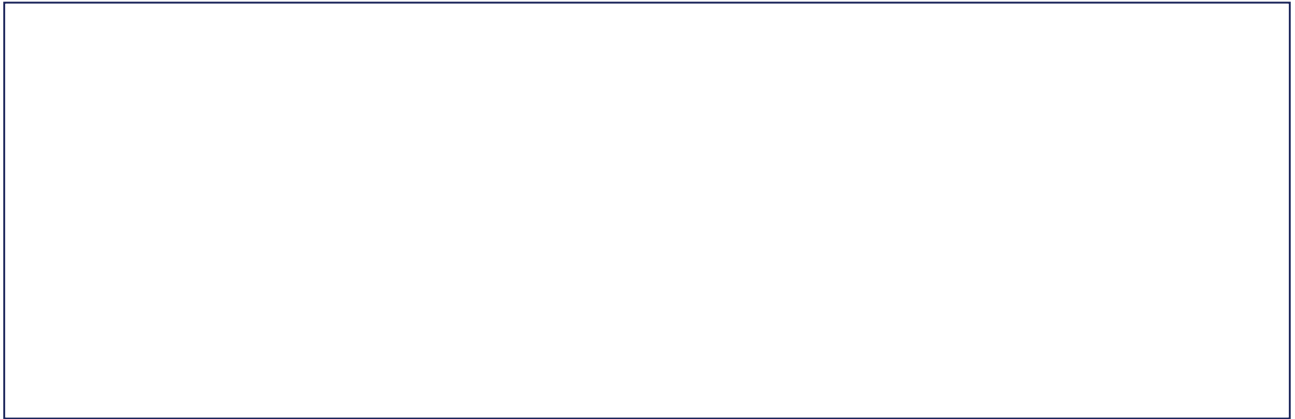
8. What is the term for the measurement of an earthquake's size? (1 mark)
