

Human and Physical Geography Flashcards

What is Physical Geography?

Physical Geography: The study of the natural features of the Earth's surface, such as mountains, rivers, and oceans.

What is Human Geography?

Human Geography: The study of how people live, how they build cities, and how they use the land.

Is a volcano a human or physical feature?

Physical Feature: A volcano is a natural landform created by geological processes.

Is a bridge a human or physical feature?

Human Feature: A bridge is man-made infrastructure built to help people cross water or valleys.

What does 'Urban' mean?

Urban: Relating to a town or city, where there are many buildings and a high population of people.

What does 'Rural' mean?

Rural: Relating to the countryside, where there are fewer buildings and more open land or farms.

What is a 'Settlement'?

Settlement: A place where people establish a community, ranging from a tiny hamlet to a giant city.

What is 'Infrastructure'?

Infrastructure: The basic physical systems of a country, such as roads, railways, and power supplies.

Which of these is a physical feature: a factory, a forest, or a road?

A Forest: Forests are natural environments created by plants and trees.

Which of these is a human feature: a valley, a port, or a hill?

A Port: A port is a man-made area where ships can load and unload goods.

What is a 'Coastline'?

Coastline: The area where the land meets the sea, which can be shaped by both natural erosion and human sea walls.

What is 'Climate'?

Climate: The long-term average of weather patterns in a specific area of the world.
