6. What is the name for a small picture used on a map to represent a real-life feature, such as a bridge or a hospital? (1 mark)

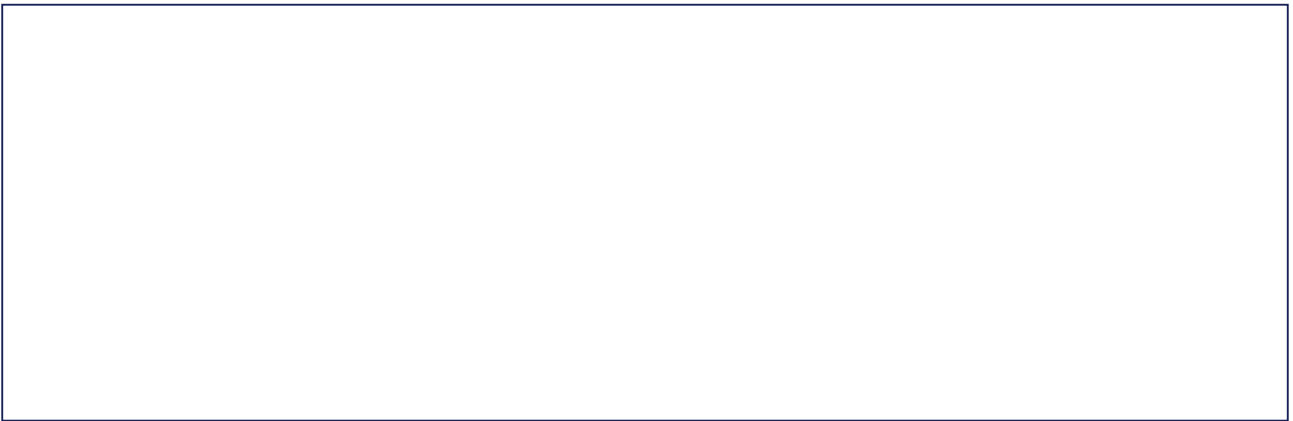
7. Which of these is NOT one of the four main cardinal points? A) South* B) North C) East D) Up (1 mark)
