Learning objective: To solve problems involving money in context, including adding and subtracting amounts and converting between Australian dollars and cents.

Max the monkey is organising a jungle market stall! Help him solve these money puzzles by choosing the right answers or calculating the totals.

6. 6. Zara buys 4 notebooks for £1 each. How much does she spend in total? (1 mark)

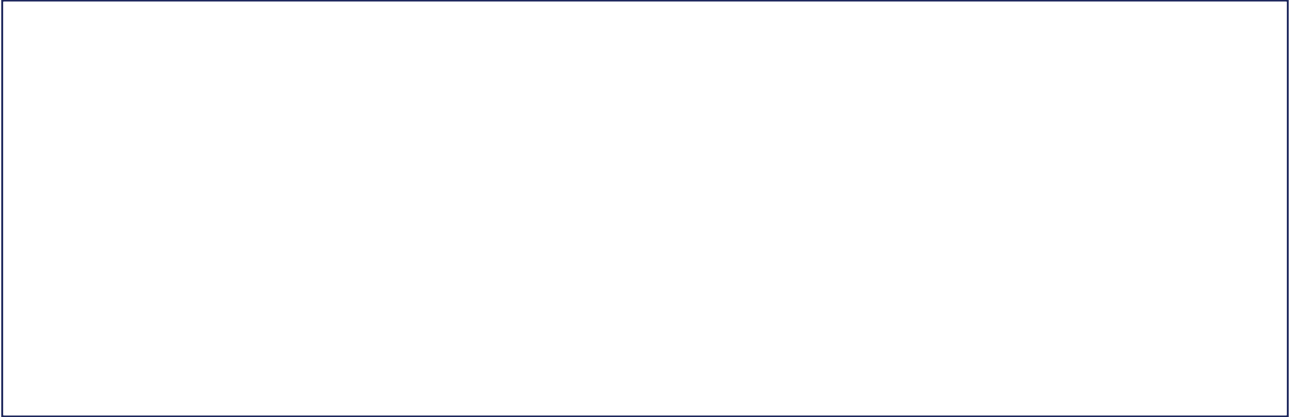
7. 7. Which amount is the largest? A) £8.09 B) £8.90 C) £8.99* D) £8.91 (1 mark)
