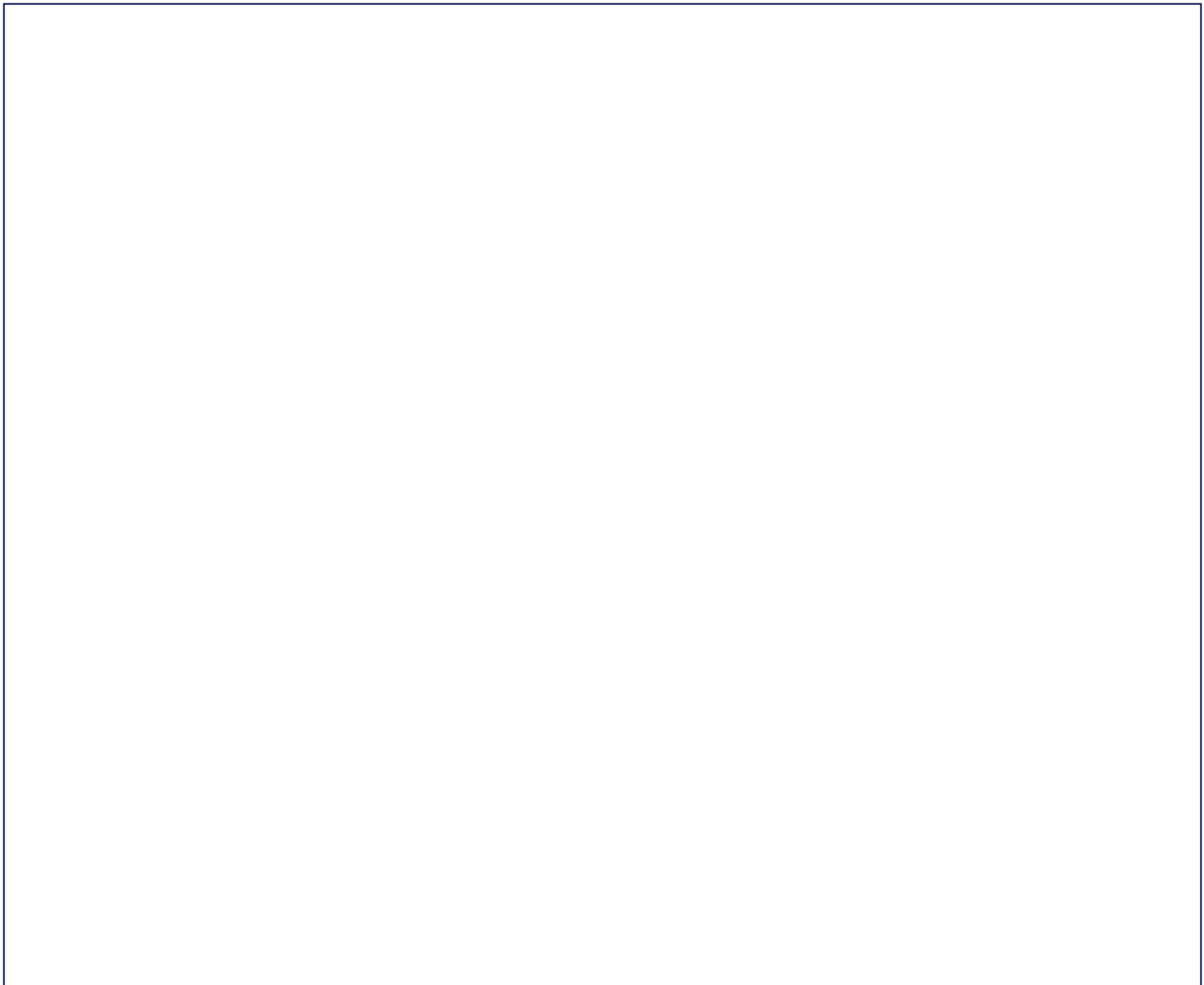


Celebrating Heroes: A PSHE Drawing Activity

Learning objective: To recognise and celebrate the contributions of significant Black individuals to history, science, and society.

Use your imagination to create a 'Hall of Heroes' mural. Choose one person from history who has made a positive impact on the world. You will draw them in the centre of your page, surrounded by symbols that represent their achievements.

Draw: In the centre of the page, draw a portrait of your chosen historical figure. Use 'action' colours (like bright yellow or bold blue) to show their energy. In the background, draw four 'symbol bubbles'. Inside these bubbles, draw items that represent their work, such as a microscope for a scientist, a quill for a writer, a microphone for a musician, or a bridge for someone who brought communities together. Use your neatest writing to label these symbols using words from the word bank.



Label words: Legacy · Inspiration · Courage · Achievement · Contribution · Change-maker · Community

Steps:

1. Identify one person you chose for your drawing. Write their name and one sentence explaining why they are an inspiration to you.
2. Which word from the word bank best describes your chosen hero and why?

3. Look at the symbols you drew around your hero. Choose two and explain what they represent in relation to that person's life.
4. How can learning about the history of others help us be kinder and more inclusive in our own classroom today?
5. If you were to add one more person to your mural, who would it be and what symbol would you draw for them?
