

PSHE Assessment: Celebrating Diversity and Inclusion

Learning objective: To understand the importance of respecting differences, celebrating diversity, and ensuring everyone feels included in our school community.

Read each question carefully. Answer in full sentences where requested. Think about how we can make our classroom a welcoming place for everyone.

In our school, every person is like a unique piece of a puzzle. Some of us speak different languages, some have different hobbies, and some of us celebrate different traditions. Diversity means that we recognise these differences, and inclusion means that we make sure everyone is invited to join in, feel safe, and be treated with kindness.

1. Define the word 'diversity' in your own words. (2 marks)

2. Max the monkey says that everyone in Year 4 should play the same games because it is easier. Explain why inclusion is better for a community than everyone being the same. (3 marks)

3. Give two examples of how you can show respect to someone who has a different background or culture to you. (4 marks)

4. What is a 'stereotype'? Why can stereotypes be unfair or harmful? (4 marks)

5. Pip the caterpillar notices a new student sitting alone at lunch. Explain the steps you would take to be inclusive and make that student feel welcome. (4 marks)

6. Imagine your school is planning an 'International Day'. Write a short paragraph (5 marks) explaining why it is important to learn about the traditions and lives of people from different parts of the world. (5 marks)

7. How much does it cost to be kind to someone who is different from you? Tick the box: £0.00 ☐ £1.00 ☐ £5.00 ☐. Why is this answer important? (3 marks)
