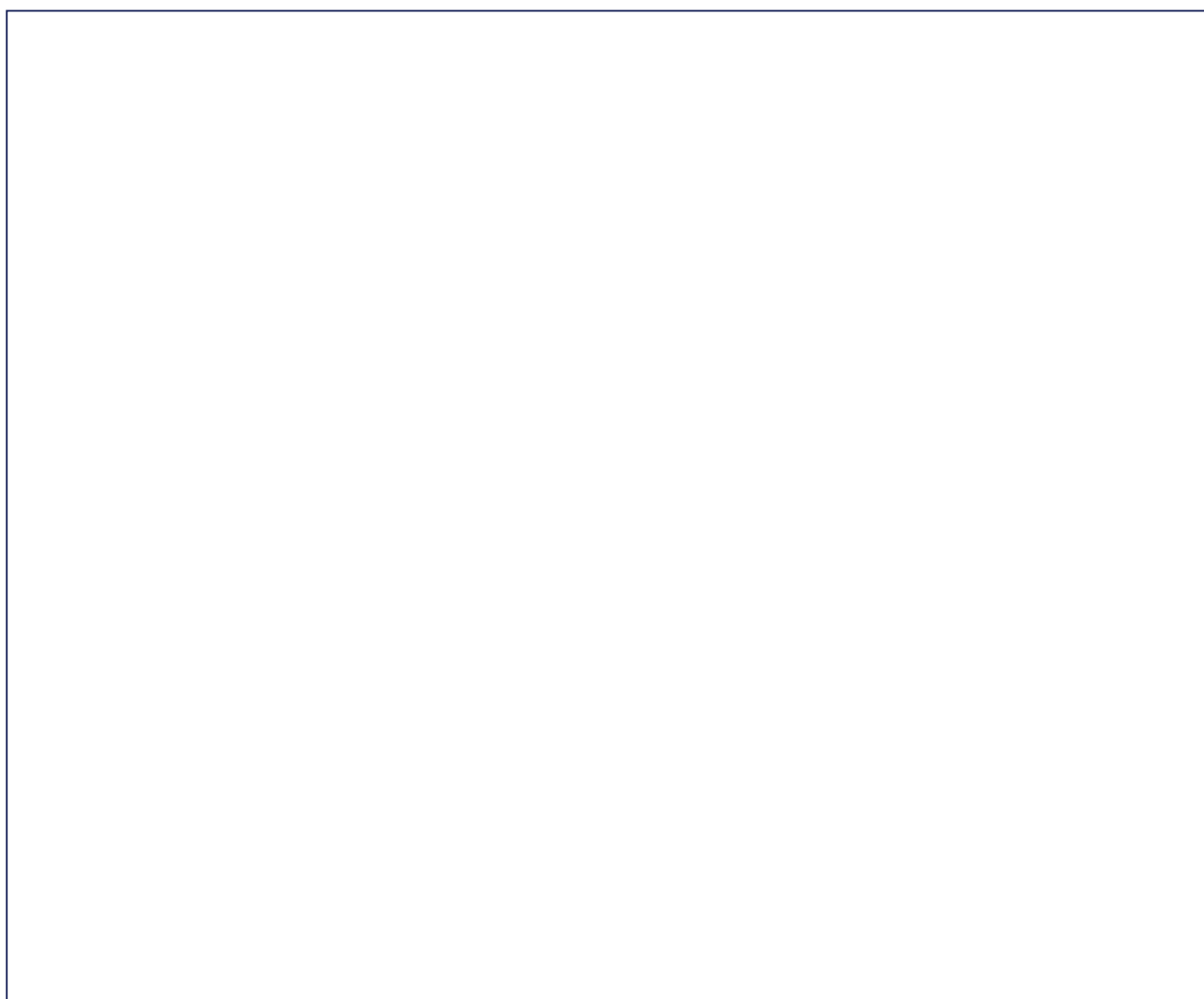


Celebrating Our Unique Community with Zara

Learning objective: To understand that everyone is unique and that diversity makes our community stronger and more interesting.

Zara the zebra loves patterns, and she knows that no two zebras have the exact same stripes! Use this sheet to design a community scene where everyone is celebrated for being themselves. Follow the steps to build your picture, then use the labels from the word bank to describe your artwork.

Draw: Create a vibrant, colourful scene on a plain background. In the centre, draw four diverse characters engaging in different hobbies. Use bright, cheerful colours. Add a background showing a shared space, like a park or a playground. Ensure the drawing style is clear and friendly, using thick outlines and imaginative details to show each character's unique personality.



Label words: Diverse · Inclusive · Kindness · Unique · Community · Respect

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a group of four friends in the centre of your page. Make sure each friend has a different interest (for example, one might be holding a book, one a paintbrush, one a football, and one a musical instrument).
2. Step 2: Around the friends, draw three things that show how they help each other (e.g., sharing a bench,

working on a project together, or helping someone up).

3. Step 3: Choose three words from the word bank and write them neatly next to your drawing to explain why the scene shows an inclusive community.

4. Comprehension: Why is it important that the four friends in your drawing have different interests?

5. Application: Zara says, 'Diversity is like a garden with many different flowers.' How does this describe a classroom? Write one sentence.
