2. Christians believe in the 'Trinity'. Can you name the three persons that make up the Trinity? (3 marks)

3. What is a 'parable', and why did Jesus use them when teaching people? (3 marks)

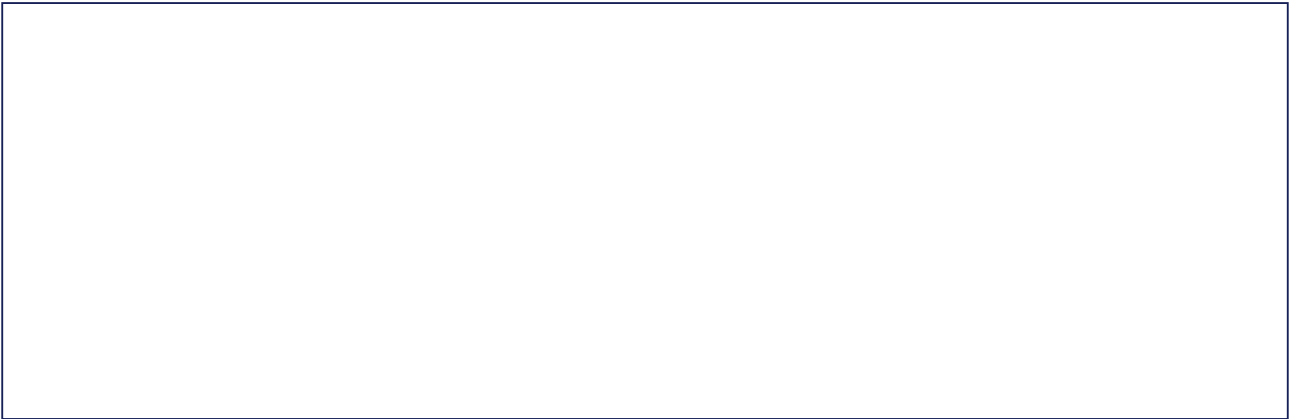
4. Look at the word bank. Which word describes a large, important church building that is often the seat of a bishop? (1 mark)

5. Describe the meaning of the cross as a symbol for Christians. What does it remind them of? (4 marks)

6. Explain the difference between the Nativity story and the Easter story. What happens in each? (8 marks)

7. Max the monkey is wondering how Christians show their faith in their daily lives. Give two examples of things a Christian might do to follow the teachings of Jesus. (5 marks)
