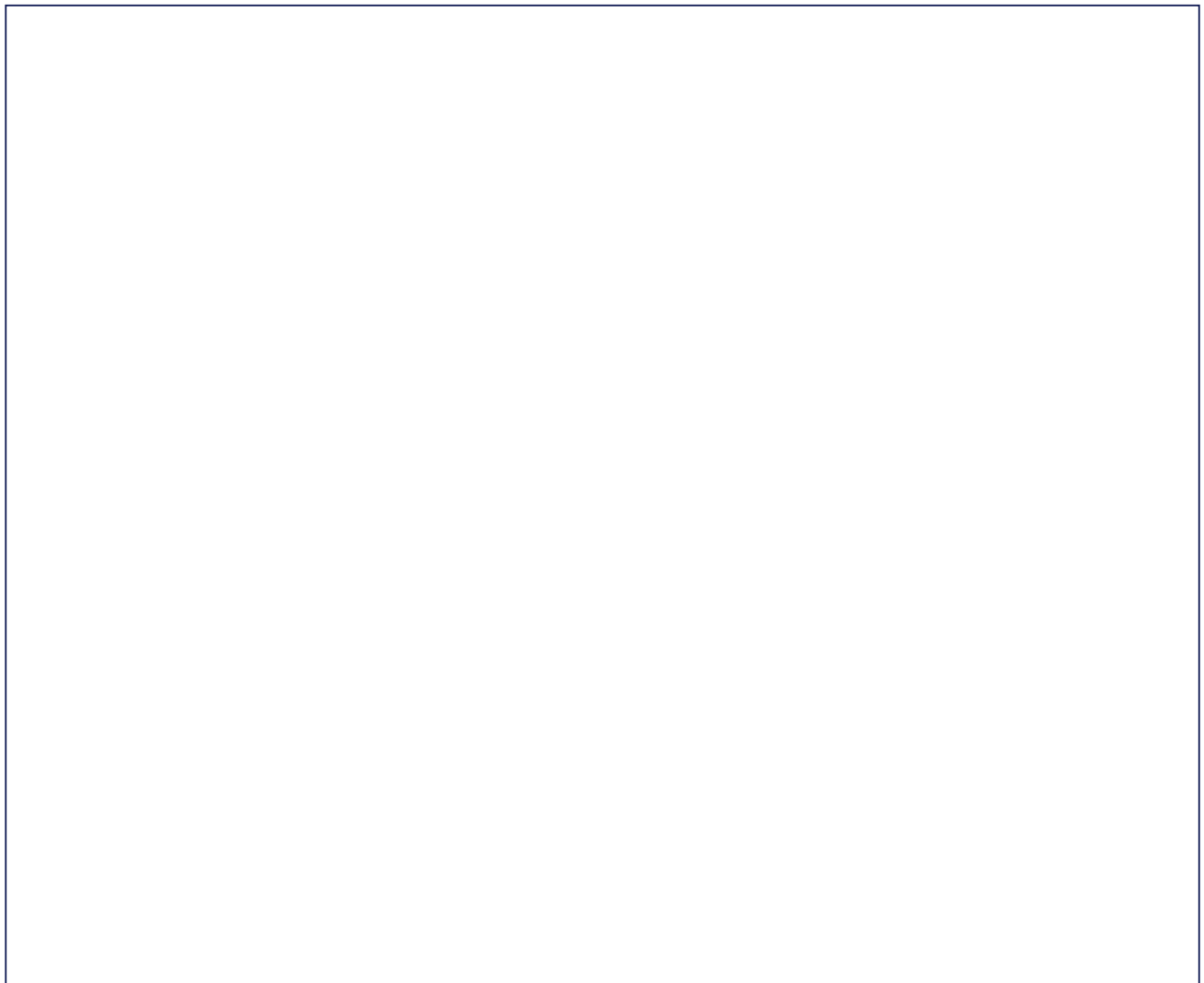


The Honest Choice: A Moral Dilemma

Learning objective: To explore the concept of moral dilemmas and reflect on the importance of honesty and integrity.

Imagine you are walking through the park and you find a wallet on the grass. Inside, there is £10 and an ID card showing who it belongs to. Max the Monkey is with you, and he thinks you should use the money to buy treats for everyone! Use the drawing space to show what happens next, then answer the questions below.

Draw: A bright, colourful scene in a public park with green grass and trees. The drawing should feature a child and Max (an enthusiastic monkey) discovering a lost wallet. The student should illustrate the sequence of finding the item, thinking about the moral choice, and the act of returning it to the owner.



Label words: Honesty · Integrity · Fairness · Choice · Consequence · Kindness

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw the scene in the park. Include yourself, Max the Monkey, and the wallet you found.
2. Step 2: Draw a 'thought bubble' above your head showing the right thing to do with the wallet.
3. Step 3: Draw the person who lost the wallet. How do they feel when you return it to them?
4. Label three parts of your drawing using words from the word bank.
5. Why is it important to be honest, even when no one is watching you?

6. How would you feel if you had lost your own wallet and a stranger returned it to you?
