

Places of Worship

Learning objective: To identify and describe key features of different places of worship and understand their purpose.

What is a place of worship? A building or space where people go to pray, reflect, and connect with their faith.	Which place of worship is used by Christians? A church.
Which place of worship is used by Muslims? A mosque.	Which place of worship is used by Jews? A synagogue.
Which place of worship is used by Hindus? A mandir.	Which place of worship is used by Sikhs? A gurdwara.
What is a minaret? A tall tower attached to a mosque, often used for the call to prayer.	What is the 'Ark' in a synagogue? A special cabinet or cupboard that holds the Torah scrolls.
What is the purpose of the Langar in a gurdwara? A community kitchen where free vegetarian meals are served to everyone, regardless of faith.	What might you find on a mandir altar? Murti (statues of deities), flowers, and incense.
What is an altar in a church? A table used for special services, such as the Eucharist or Holy Communion.	Why do people remove their shoes before entering some places of worship? To show respect and to keep the sacred space clean.
