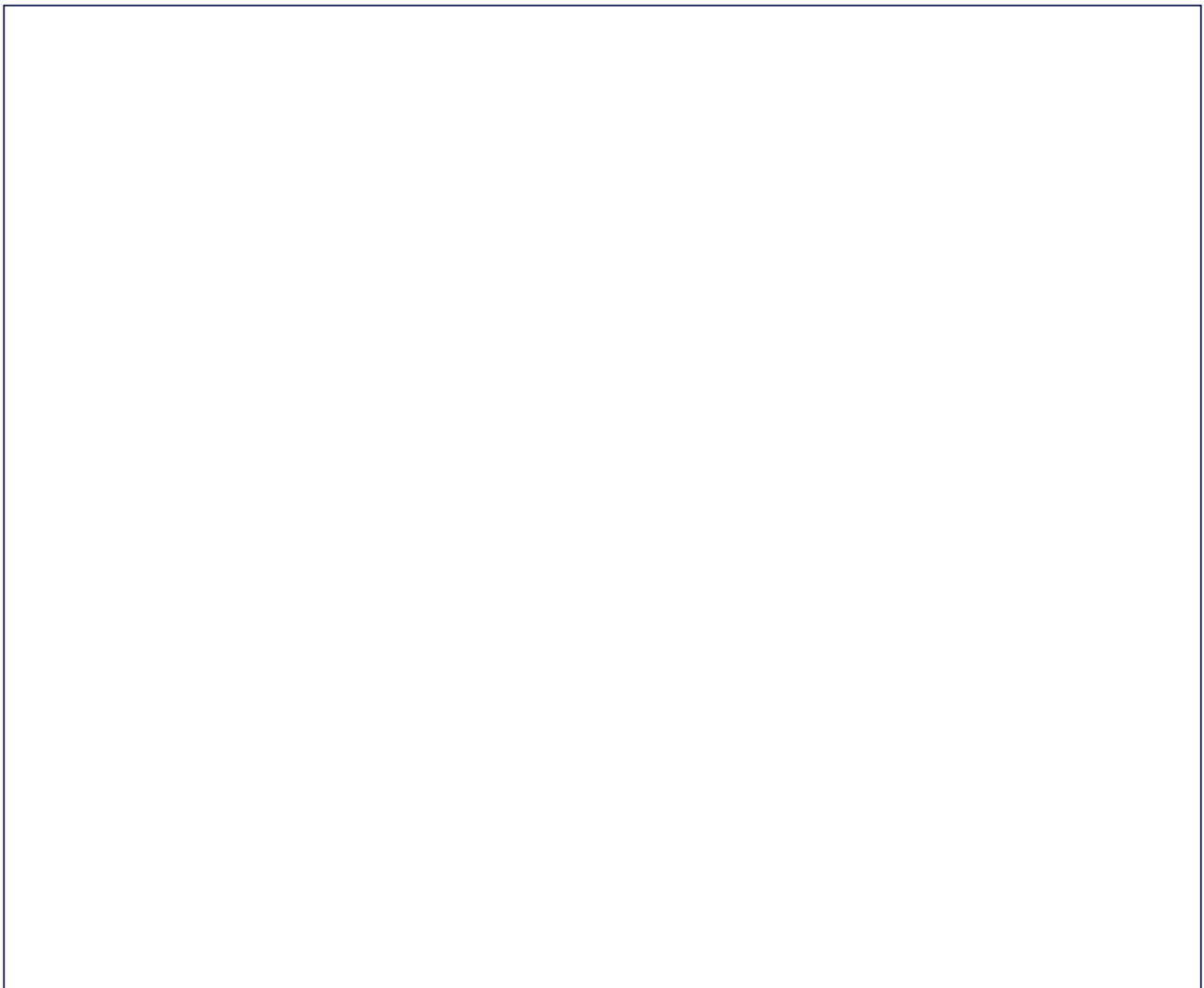


Sacred Texts: A World of Wisdom

Learning objective: To identify and represent different sacred texts and understand their importance to religious believers.

Pip the caterpillar is helping us explore the special books used in different religions. In the large box, draw a scene showing how different sacred texts are kept and used. Use the word bank to label your drawing and answer the questions below to show what you have learned.

Draw: Create a detailed scene showing a variety of sacred texts from different world religions. Include elements that show reverence, such as decorative cloths, holders, or people reading quietly in a place of worship. Use bright colours to show the beauty of the books and the environment.



Label words: The Bible · The Qur'an · The Torah · The Guru Granth Sahib · Scripture · Respect · Wisdom

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a special place where a sacred text might be kept (such as a pulpit, a shelf, or a beautiful cover).
2. Step 2: Draw two different sacred texts and label them using the word bank.
3. Step 3: Draw a person showing respect while reading or holding a sacred text.
4. Why do you think sacred texts are kept in special ways or treated with great care?

5. What do religious believers hope to find when they read their sacred texts?
6. Can a sacred text be used to help a person make a decision in their daily life? Explain how.
