

A Picnic with Rosa the Parrot

Learning objective: To learn and use Spanish vocabulary for common food and drink items, and to express preferences using 'Me gusta' and 'No me gusta'.

Help Rosa get ready for her picnic! Use the word bank to answer the questions below. Remember to check your spellings carefully.

Rosa the parrot is packing her basket for a trip to the park. She loves to eat healthy fruit, but she also enjoys a treat now and then! She wants to make sure she has enough food to share with her friends.

Word bank: la manzana (apple) · el plátano (banana) · el queso (cheese) · el pan (bread) · el agua (water) · el zumo (juice) · la pizza (pizza) · el helado (ice cream)

1. Rosa wants to pack a piece of fruit that is yellow and a drink that is made from fruit. Write these two items in Spanish. (2 marks)

2. Translate the following sentence into English: 'Me gusta el queso y el pan.' (2 marks)

3. If Rosa does not like ice cream, how would she say 'I do not like ice cream' in Spanish? (2 marks)

4. Look at the list of food. Which two items would you choose for your own picnic basket? Write your answer in a full Spanish sentence starting with 'Me gusta...' (2 marks)

5. If a slice of pizza costs £2.50 and an apple costs 50p, how much would they cost altogether? Write the total in Australian dollars and cents. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw your perfect picnic basket. Include at least three food items from the word bank and label them in Spanish.



Extension challenge: Research one other Spanish food item that is not in the word bank. Write its name, draw it, and write a sentence explaining if you would like to try it (Me gusta / No me gusta).
