

Rosa's Spanish Market Adventure

Learning objective: To learn and apply Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, food items, and money.

Follow the drawing prompts to create your own Spanish market stall. Use the word bank to label your items and practise your Spanish shopping phrases.

Draw: Create a colourful scene of a market stall managed by Rosa the parrot. In the centre, draw a wooden table covered with a checked tablecloth. On the table, draw a basket of fruit and a loaf of bread. Add a small chalkboard sign leaning against the stall. Use bright colours to make your market look busy and welcoming. Label the items clearly using the Spanish words provided in the word bank.



Label words: la manzana (apple) · el plátano (banana) · el pan (bread) · ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much?) · un euro (one euro) · la tienda (the shop)

Steps:

1. Draw a fruit stall in the space provided. Include at least two types of fruit from the word bank and label them in Spanish.
2. Draw a price tag next to your bread showing the cost as £1.50. Write the Spanish question '¿Cuánto cuesta?' above it.
3. If you buy an apple for 50p and a banana for 40p, what is the total cost in Australian dollars and cents?

4. Rosa is holding a basket. Draw the basket and inside it, draw one item you would like to buy from your market stall.
5. Translate the following into English: 'El pan cuesta un euro.'
