

Shopping with Rosa: ¡Vamos de compras!

Learning objective: To learn and use Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and simple transactions.

Help Rosa the parrot prepare for a trip to the local market. Use the word bank to translate, calculate, and complete the sentences.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? · La manzana · El pan · Tengo · La tienda · Un euro · Diez libras · ¿Qué desea? · Por favor · Gracias

1. Rosa is at the bakery. Write the Spanish phrase she should use to ask 'How much does it cost?' (2 marks)

2. The baker asks Rosa, '¿Qué desea?' (What would you like?). Write a sentence in Spanish saying you would like an apple and some bread. (3 marks)

3. An apple costs £1.00 (Un euro) and the bread costs £2.00 (Dos euros). If you have £10.00 (Diez libras), how much money will you have left? Show your working in pounds. (3 marks)

4. Translate the following shopping manners into Spanish: 'Please' and 'Thank you'. (2 marks)

5. Imagine you are at the market. Write a short dialogue (2 lines) between you and a shopkeeper using at least two words from the word bank. (4 marks)

Draw: Draw a colourful market stall in Spain. Include a basket, some fruit, and a price tag that says '£3.00'.



Extension challenge: Research three more items you might find in a Spanish market. Write their names in Spanish and draw them in your book with a price label in pounds.
