

Rosa's Weather Report: El Tiempo

Learning objective: To identify and use key Spanish vocabulary to describe the weather and understand how to talk about the climate.

Read the questions carefully and use the word bank to help you complete the Spanish phrases. Rosa the parrot is waiting to hear your answers!

Word bank: Hace sol · Hace frío · Hace calor · Llueve · Hace viento · Está nublado

1. Rosa is looking out of the window and sees the sun shining brightly. Write the correct Spanish phrase to describe this weather. (1 mark)

2. If it is a very chilly winter day and you need a thick coat, which Spanish phrase would you use to describe the temperature? Write it below. (1 mark)

3. When you look at the sky and see many grey clouds blocking the sun, how do you say 'It is cloudy' in Spanish? (1 mark)

4. Explain why we use the phrase 'Hace' for some weather descriptions, but not for 'Llueve'. Think about whether 'Llueve' is an action or a state. (2 marks)

5. If you were planning a picnic in the park, which two weather phrases from the word bank would be the best to have? Explain your choice. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a four-panel grid. In each square, draw a different weather type (Sunny, Rainy, Windy, Cloudy) and write the correct Spanish label underneath each drawing.



Extension challenge: Write a short weather forecast for Rosa the parrot. Imagine she is flying to Spain tomorrow—tell her what the weather is like in your town today using a full Spanish sentence: 'Hoy en Inglaterra...'
