

Conjunctions Flashcards

Learning objective: To recognize and use conjunctions in sentences to connect ideas

Learn about conjunctions and their use in making sentences more interesting and informative.

and

A conjunction used to add or introduce another idea, such as 'Pip likes reading books and collecting words.'

but

A conjunction used to show contrast or difference, such as 'Max is enthusiastic about maths but sometimes finds it challenging.'

or

A conjunction used to offer a choice, such as 'Finn can explore the ocean or map the world's geography.'

so

A conjunction used to show a result or consequence, such as 'Ellie remembers the history of ancient Egypt so well that she can tell us about the pyramids so vividly.'

because

A conjunction used to give a reason or explanation, such as 'Leo writes poetry because he loves using words to express his feelings.'

for

A conjunction used to give a reason or explanation, similar to 'because', such as 'Bee Kit likes computing for the fun of solving puzzles.'

yet

A conjunction used to show a surprising result, such as 'Nova loves stargazing yet has never seen the Milky Way.'

nor

A conjunction used to add a negative idea, such as 'Pip collects words but not many insects, nor does he have a pet.'
