

The School Garden Report

Learning objective: I can write an effective report about the school garden.

Read the passage below and use the vocabulary from the word bank to complete the report. Then answer the questions that follow.

The school garden is a wonderful place to learn about growth and development. Pip, a bookworm caterpillar, and her friends were tasked with writing a report about the garden. They spent a whole day observing the different plants and making notes.

1. What was Pip and her friends tasked with doing? (1 mark)

2. What did Pip and her friends spend a whole day doing in the garden? (2 marks)

3. What is one thing that Pip and her friends might write about in their report? (1 mark)

4. What is another thing that Pip and her friends might write about in their report? (1 mark)

5. How can people help plants grow in the school garden? (3 marks)

6. What is the purpose of fertiliser in the school garden? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of the school garden and label the different types of plants that are growing there.



Extension challenge: Imagine that you are in charge of the school garden. Write a report to the headteacher suggesting new projects and ideas for improving the garden.
