

Rosa's French Feast: Le Festin Français

Grab your fork and join Rosa the parrot on a tasty tour of French food!

- In French, we use 'un' or 'le' for masculine words and 'une' or 'la' for feminine words. Remember: practice saying 'J'aime le fromage' to say 'I like cheese'.
- A croissant is a delicious, buttery pastry that is very famous in France. Can you spot the word 'croissant' in our word bank?
- You can express your taste by saying 'J'aime' (I like) followed by your favourite food, such as 'J'aime le chocolat'.
- To say you do not like something, simply start your sentence with 'Je n'aime pas', for example, 'Je n'aime pas la pomme'.
- Healthy eating is important! Try to name three fruits or vegetables you enjoy and look up their French names for your next meal.

Did you know? Did you know? In France, bread is so important that many people buy a fresh, long loaf called a 'baguette' every single morning from their local bakery, which is known as a 'boulangerie'!
