

Rosa's Number Adventure in France

Learning objective: To recognise, read, and write French numbers from 1 to 20.

Read the story below about Rosa the parrot's trip to a French market. Use the word bank to help you answer the questions about the items she finds.

Rosa the parrot has flown across the channel to visit a sunny market in France. She loves counting everything she sees! First, she spots un red apple for £1. Then, she sees deux shiny pears. At the bakery, she buys trois warm croissants. She walks past a stall with quatre colourful sunflowers and sees cinq blue boats in the harbour. Finally, she finds a basket filled with seize bright strawberries. She is having a wonderful time practising her counting in French!

1. How many croissants did Rosa buy? Write your answer in French. (1 mark)

2. Rosa saw five blue boats. How do you write the number five in French? (1 mark)

3. If Rosa buys 10 oranges and 7 bananas, how many pieces of fruit does she have altogether? Write the total number in French. (2 marks)

4. Look at the word bank. What is the French word for the number 16? (1 mark)

5. If an apple costs £1 (un pound), how much would quatre apples cost? Write the number in French. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a basket filled with exactly 'dix' (10) pieces of fruit. Label your drawing using the French word for the number 10.



Extension challenge: Choose three numbers between 11 and 20. Write a short sentence for each, describing items you might find at a shop, such as 'J'ai douze biscuits' (I have 12 biscuits).
