

Exploring the World's Biomes with Finn

Learning objective: To describe the characteristics of a specific biome, including its climate, vegetation, and wildlife.

Finn the dolphin has been mapping the world's different biomes! Choose one biome (such as the Tropical Rainforest, Hot Desert, or Tundra) and use this frame to write a detailed report about it.

A biome is a large area of the Earth that shares similar weather patterns and living things.

1. Introduction: Which biome have you chosen and where in the world is it usually found?

2. Climate: What is the weather like in this biome? Think about temperature and rainfall.

3. Plants: What kinds of plants grow here and how do they survive in this environment?

4. Animals: Which animals live in this biome and what special features (adaptations) do they have?

5. Human Impact: How do people live in this biome or how is the environment being changed?

6. Summary: Why is this biome important to the rest of the planet?

Extension challenge: Can you compare your chosen biome with another one? Use connectives like 'whereas' or 'similarly' to explain the differences in their climates.
