1. 1. Who was the nurse who travelled to the Crimean War to care for soldiers and set up the 'British Hotel'? (2 marks)

2. 2. Which brave man was one of the first Black professional footballers in England and later became a decorated officer in the First World War? (2 marks)

3. 3. Who became a famous symbol of the fight for equal rights in the United States after refusing to give up a seat on a bus? (2 marks)

4. 4. Which influential poet and author used his words to challenge unfairness and celebrate multicultural Britain? (2 marks)

5. 5. Choose one of the people above. In your own words, explain how their actions helped to make the world a fairer place. (2 marks)
