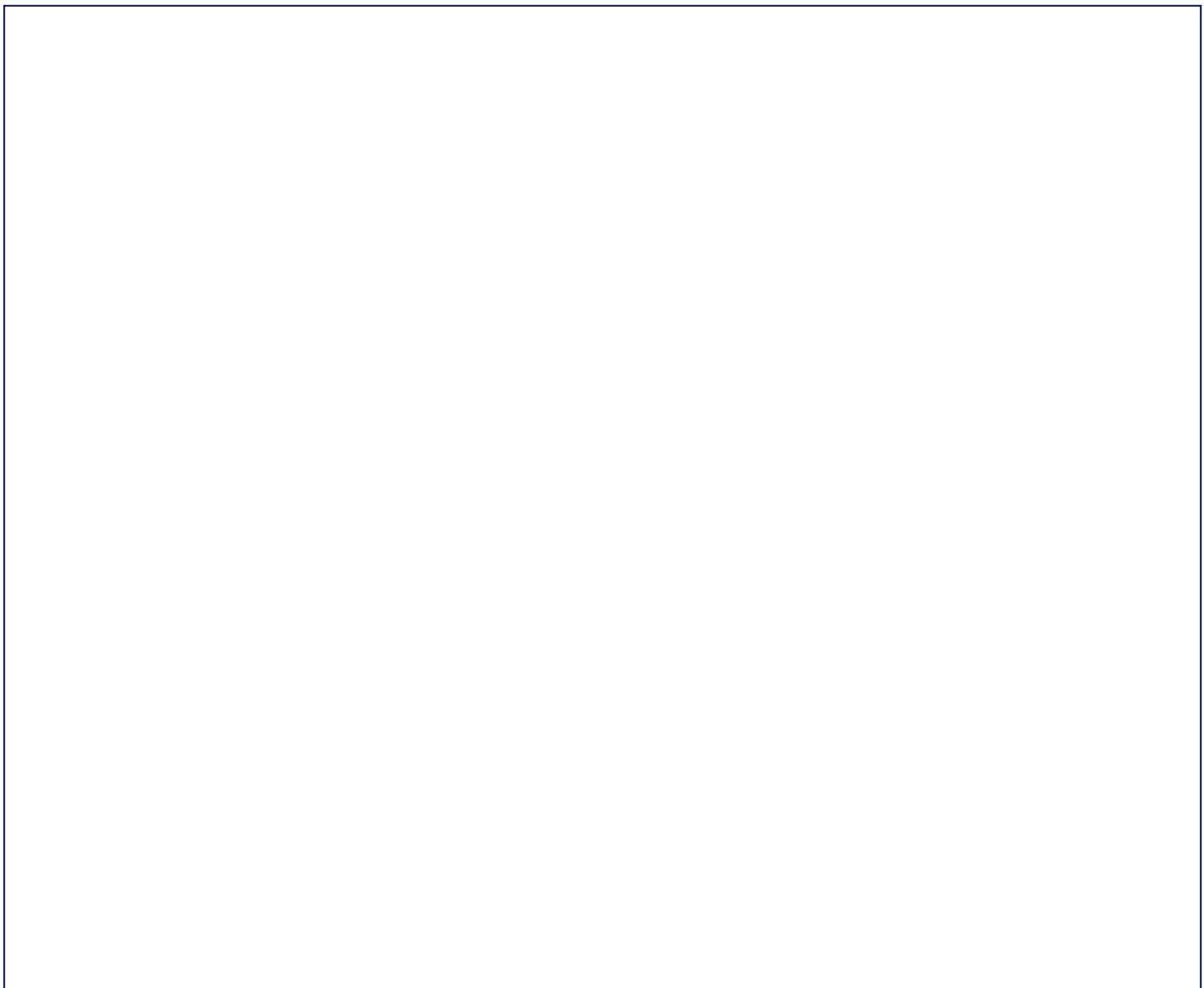


Social Studies / History Heroes: Mary Seacole's Compassion

Learning objective: To understand the contributions of Mary Seacole to medical care during the Crimean War and develop historical empathy.

Use your knowledge of Mary Seacole to complete the drawing task. Add labels to your sketch to show you understand how she helped soldiers during the war.

Draw: Draw a scene showing Mary Seacole at her 'British Hotel'. Include Mary in the centre wearing her signature colourful dress and apron. Around her, draw soldiers resting and show the supplies she provided, such as bowls of hot soup, bandages, and medicine bottles. Use a warm, caring style and ensure the background looks like a busy, welcoming place.
