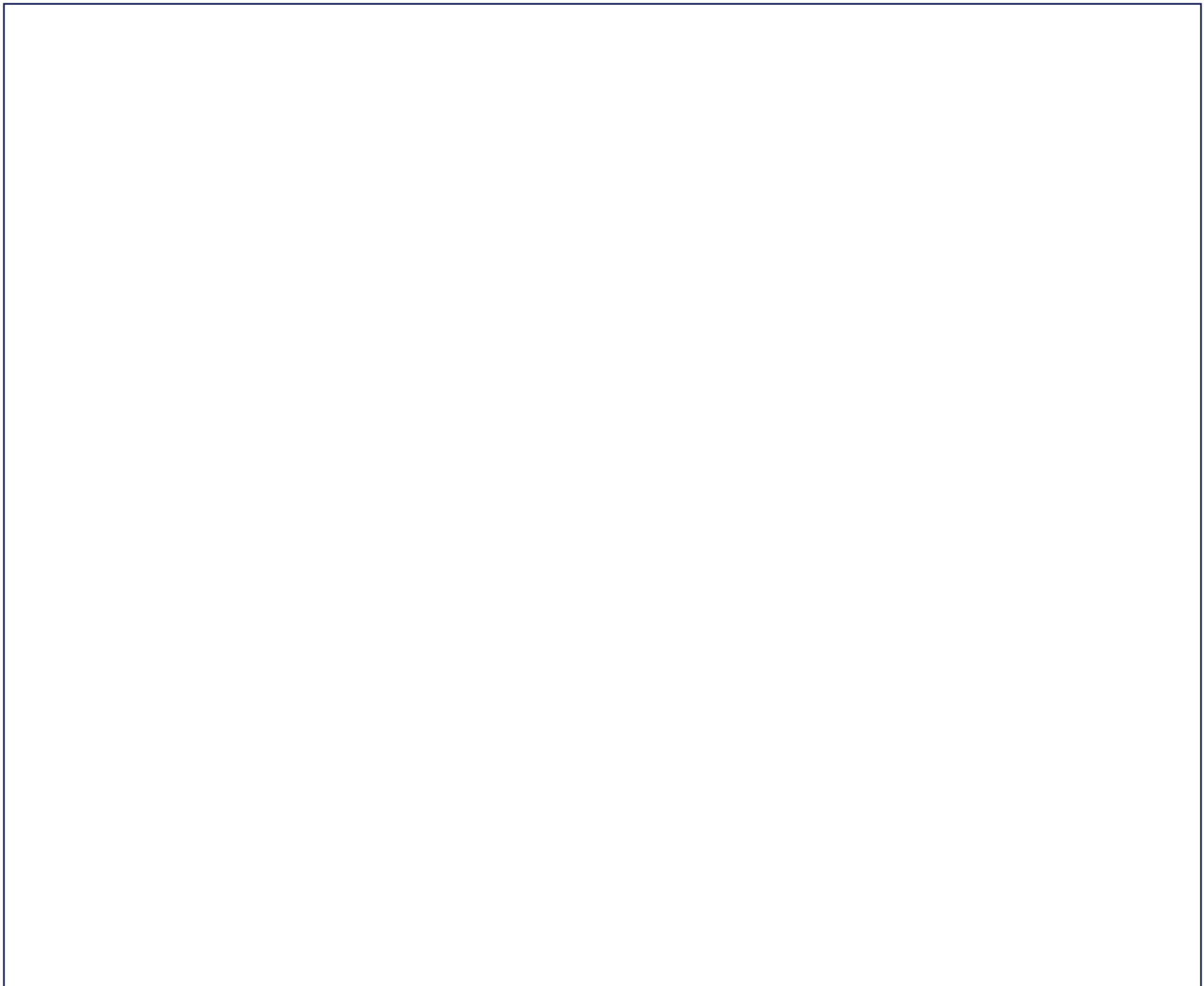


Ellie's Tudor Discovery Sketchbook

Learning objective: To identify and illustrate key features of Tudor fashion and daily life in the 16th century.

Follow the steps below to complete your Tudor scene. Use your knowledge of the Tudor period to add accurate details to your drawing.

Draw: Draw a large Tudor scene. In the centre, draw a person wearing 16th-century clothing, including a large ruff around their neck and a doublet. In the background, draw a house with black wooden beams and white plaster walls (timber-framed). In the corner, include a Tudor Rose symbol. Use fine lines to show detail in the fabric and the wooden beams.



Label words: Ruff · Doublet · Tudor Rose · Timber-framed · Breeches · Farthingale

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a Tudor house in the background. What feature makes it look like a Tudor building rather than a modern one?
2. Step 2: Draw a Tudor person. Label their 'ruff' and 'doublet' using the word bank.
3. Step 3: What symbol would you draw on the person's clothing to show their loyalty to the Tudor family?
4. Step 4: Draw a simple Tudor garden. Why were gardens important for food and medicine during this time?
5. Step 5: Write one sentence explaining why rich Tudor clothes were often made of expensive materials like

silk or velvet.
