1. 1. You are playing a game online and someone you do not know asks for your home address. What do you do? (2 marks)

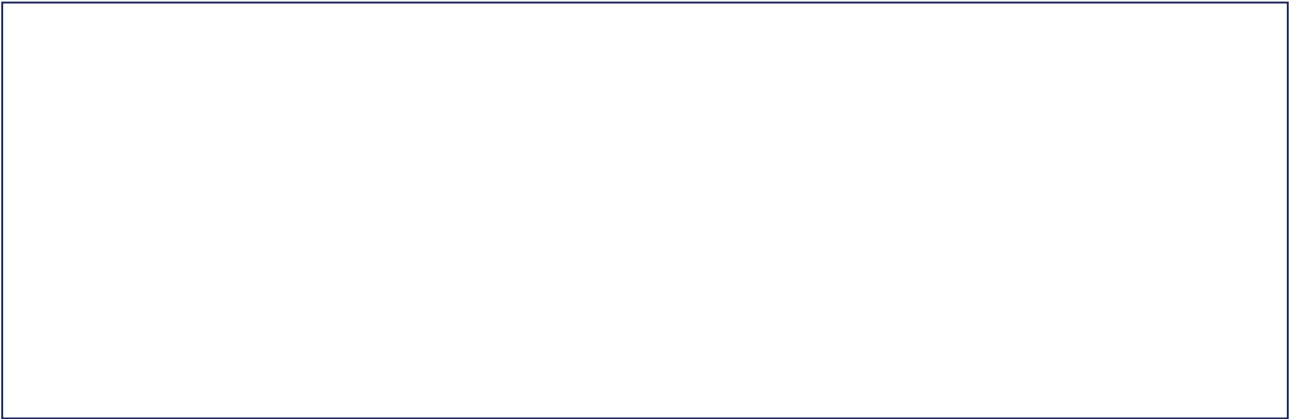
2. 2. You want to share a photo of yourself and your friends on a public social site. Is this a good idea? (2 marks)

3. 3. A website asks you to create a password. You decide to use your nickname and your birthday. Is this a strong password? (2 marks)

4. 4. You see something online that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable. Who is the best person to tell? (2 marks)

5. 5. A friend tells you they are talking to someone online who promised to send them free items for their game account if they share their login details. What should you advise your friend? (2 marks)
