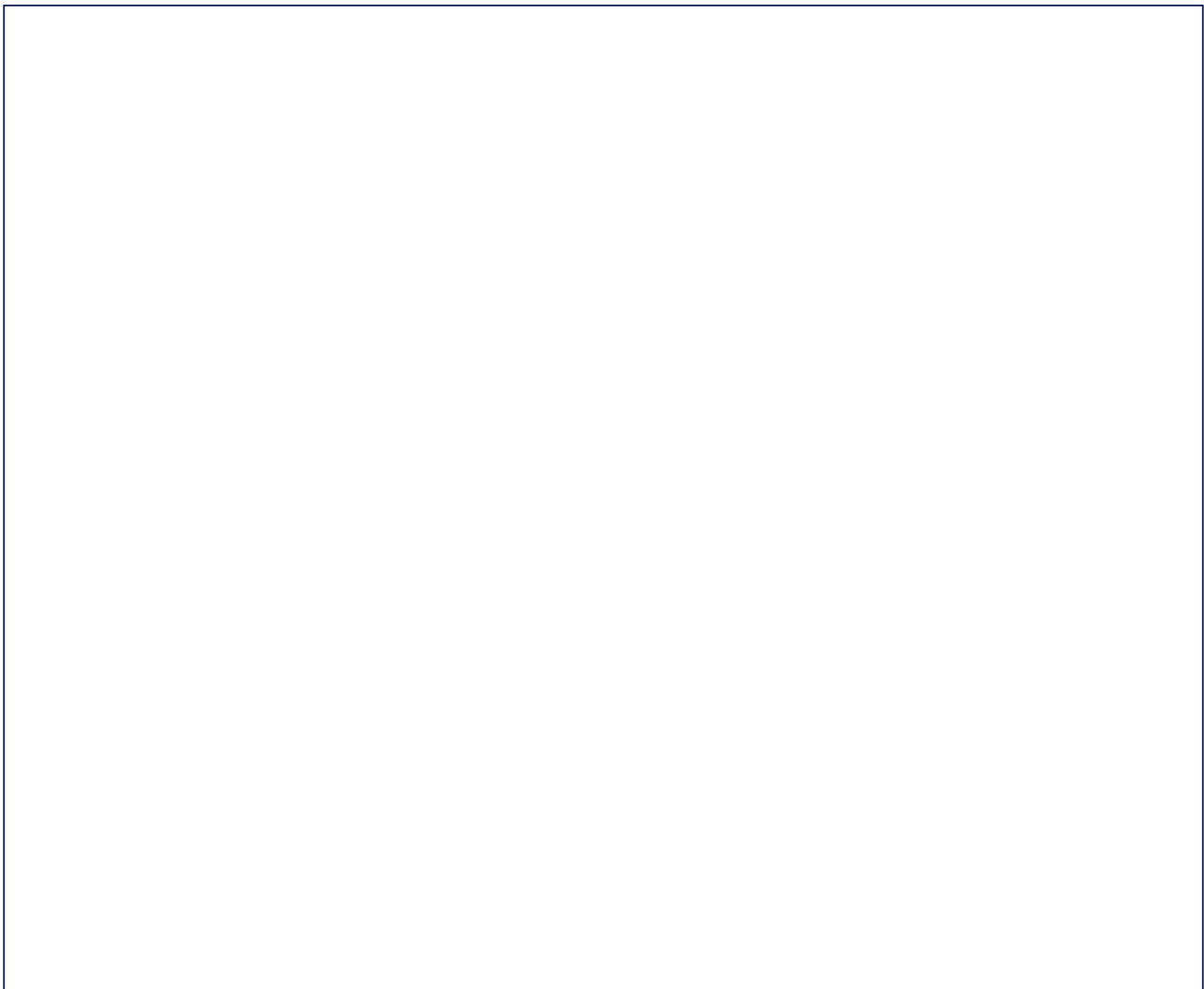


The Story of Easter: A Visual Journey

Learning objective: To demonstrate an understanding of the key events and symbols associated with the Easter story through drawing and labelling.

Use the drawing space to create a scene that shows the most important parts of the Easter story. Follow the steps to build your picture, then use the word bank to label the key symbols and people in your artwork.

Draw: Create a multi-part scene or a 'story-map' on your page. Divide your page into four quadrants. In the first, draw the entry into Jerusalem with palm leaves. In the second, draw the Last Supper table. In the third, draw the scene at Golgotha with the cross. In the fourth, draw the garden tomb with the stone rolled away and a bright morning sun.



Label words: Palm Sunday · The Last Supper · The Cross · The Empty Tomb · The Resurrection · Olive Branch · Stone

Steps:

1. Step 1: In the first part of your drawing, show the crowds welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem. What items did the people hold to show their respect?
2. Step 2: Draw a table representing the Last Supper. Label this part of your drawing using a word from the word bank.
3. Step 3: Draw a cross on a hill to represent the crucifixion. Why is the cross a significant symbol for

Christians?

4. Step 4: Draw a large stone rolled away from the entrance of a cave. Label this 'The Empty Tomb'.
5. Step 5: Draw a bright light or a rising sun behind the tomb to symbolise the Resurrection. What does the Resurrection mean to believers?
6. Final Step: Add a symbol of peace, such as an olive branch or a lily, to the corner of your page. Label it clearly.
