

Rosa's Family Tree: Mi Familia

Learning objective: To identify and use Spanish vocabulary for family members and describe relationships within a family unit.

Read the clues carefully and use your Spanish vocabulary to identify the family members. Answer the questions in English or Spanish as requested.

Rosa the parrot is very proud of her family! She is drawing a family tree to share with her friends. She has a brother, a mother, a father, and two grandparents.

Word bank: madre (mother) · padre (father) · hermano (brother) · hermana (sister) · abuelo (grandfather) · abuela (grandmother) · tío (uncle) · tía (aunt) · primo/prima (cousin)

1. If Rosa says 'Mi madre es amable', what does she mean in English? (2 marks)

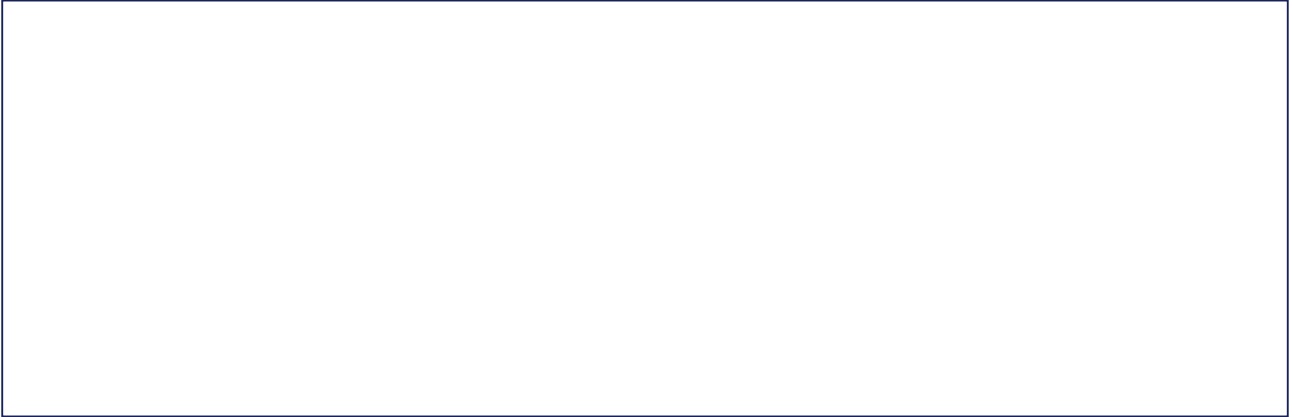
2. Write the Spanish word for 'grandfather' and 'grandmother'. (2 marks)

3. If Rosa introduces her sibling as 'mi hermano', is it a boy or a girl? (1 mark)

4. Translate this sentence into Spanish: 'My brother is funny.' (Use 'es divertido' for 'is funny'). (2 marks)

5. Why do you think it is useful to know the difference between 'tío' and 'tía' when speaking Spanish? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw your own family tree in the space below. Label at least four family members in Spanish using the words from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Write three short sentences describing your family members in Spanish. For example: 'Mi madre es alta' (My mother is tall) or 'Mi hermano es inteligente' (My brother is clever).
