

Rosa's Busy Market Day

Learning objective: To learn and use Spanish vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items.

Read the story about Rosa the parrot visiting the market. Then, answer the questions in the space provided to show what you have learnt about Spanish shopping phrases.

Rosa the parrot has flown to a sunny market to help her friends with their shopping. She lands on a stall filled with fresh fruit and warm bread. A shopkeeper smiles at her. Rosa chirps, '¡Hola! ¿Cuánto cuesta la manzana?' The shopkeeper replies, 'Cuesta ochenta peniques.' Rosa nods and asks for the bread too. 'El pan, por favor.' She pays using her pocket money, ensuring she says 'Gracias' before flying back to the BookFlik library to share her new Spanish words with the others.

Word bank: ¿Cuánto cuesta? (How much does it cost?) · La manzana (The apple) · El pan (The bread) · Por favor (Please) · Gracias (Thank you) · Un euro (One euro) · Dos libras (Two pounds)

1. What does Rosa ask the shopkeeper when she wants to know the price of an item? (2 marks)

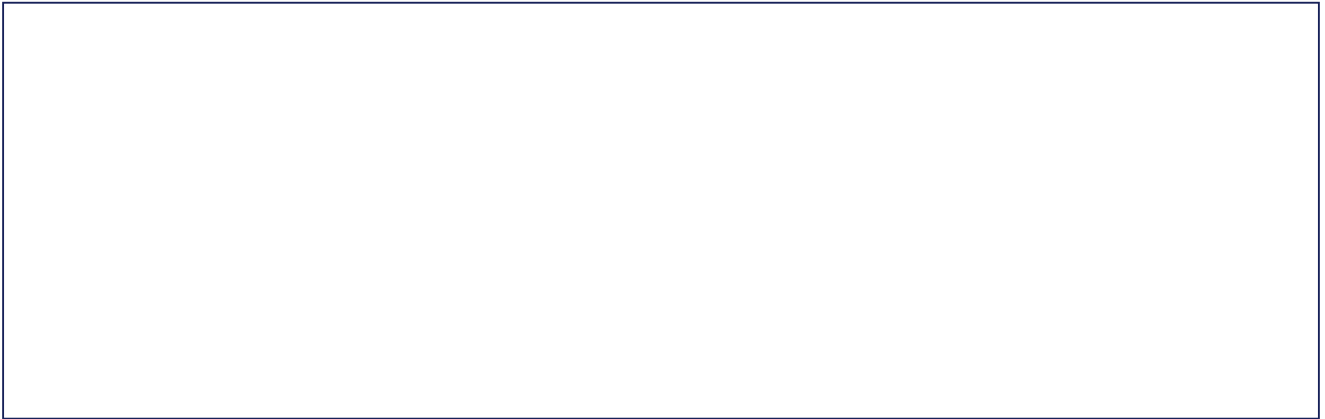
2. Translate the phrase 'El pan' into English. (1 mark)

3. Why is it important for Rosa to say 'Gracias' at the end of her shopping trip? (2 marks)

4. If an apple costs 80p (ochenta peniques) and Rosa buys two, how much does she spend in total? (2 marks)

5. Write a short sentence in Spanish that you could use if you were buying a piece of fruit at a market. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a colourful market stall with Rosa the parrot choosing some fruit. Label the items you draw using the Spanish words from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Imagine you are at a Spanish market with Max the monkey. Write a short dialogue (3-4 lines) between you and the shopkeeper where you buy two different items and ask how much they cost.
