

Zara's Guide to the Magic of Colour

Explore the Spectrum: Let your creativity shine with Zara the Zebra!

- **Primary colours** are the base colours that cannot be made by mixing others: Red, Yellow, and Blue.
- **Secondary colours** are created by mixing two primary colours together, such as Green, Orange, and Purple.
- A **tint** is created by adding white to a colour to make it lighter, while a **shade** is created by adding black to make it darker.
- **Warm colours** sit on one side of the colour wheel, reminding us of sunlight and fire, while **cool colours** remind us of water and plants.
- The **colour wheel** is a circular diagram that shows how different colours relate to one another.

Did you know? Did you know? Even though Zara is black and white, she loves using the colour wheel to imagine the world in bright, vivid patterns! Scientists have discovered that colours can change how we feel—warm colours like red and yellow can make a room feel cosy, while cool colours like blue and green can make us feel calm.
