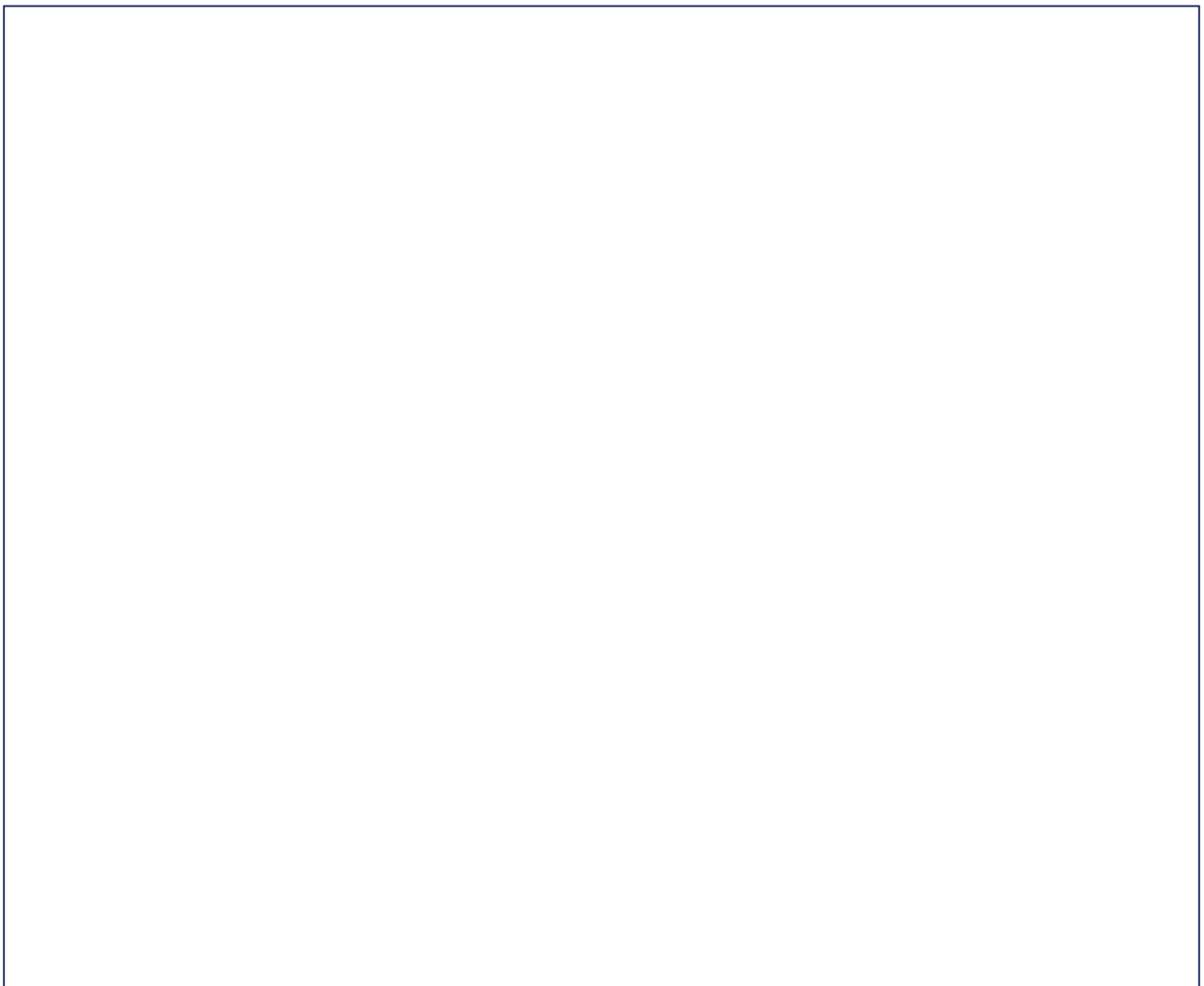


World Book Day: My Story Adventure

Learning objective: To create an original illustration that captures the magic of storytelling, demonstrating an understanding of composition and detail.

Today, our friend Pip the bookworm is exploring a world inside a book! Use your imagination to draw the scene Pip is visiting. Think about the setting, the characters, and the colours you want to use. Follow the steps below to build your masterpiece.

Draw: Draw a scene where Pip is reading a magical book that is 'leaking' its story into the real world. For example, if Pip is reading a book about the sea, draw waves and sea creatures appearing out of the pages. **Style:** Use light pencil sketches first, then go over them with coloured pencils or fine-liners. Focus on creating a clear foreground (Pip and the book) and a detailed background (the story world).



Label words: Background · Foreground · Texture · Expression · Perspective · Vivid · Detail

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw Pip the bookworm in the centre of your page. Give Pip a joyful expression. How will you show Pip is reading a book?
2. Step 2: Decide on your 'world'. Are you drawing a forest, a space station, or an underwater city? Draw the horizon line to show where the ground meets the sky.

3. Step 3: Add two items from your chosen world in the foreground to show detail. What objects make your setting look real?
4. Step 4: Use your pencil to add texture to your drawing. For example, use short, quick lines for grass or soft, rounded shapes for clouds.
5. Step 5: Label your drawing using at least three words from the word bank provided.
