

Kit's Digital Safety Map

Learning objective: To identify how to stay safe online and understand the importance of keeping personal information private.

Follow the drawing prompt below to create your digital safety poster. Use the word bank to label your creation and answer the questions to show what you have learnt about being a responsible internet user.

Draw: Draw a scene featuring Kit the fox sitting at a computer desk. In the background, draw a 'Digital Safety Shield' on the wall. Inside the shield, draw icons representing a password (a padlock), a person to talk to (a speech bubble), and a 'Report' button. Use bright colours and clear labels from the word bank to show which parts of the internet are safe and which parts require caution.



Label words: Private Information · Password · Trusted Adult · Report · Block · Kindness
