

Kit's Internet Safety Explorer Flashcards

Learning objective: To understand how to stay safe, respectful, and responsible when using the internet in line with Year 4 computing expectations.

Read the front of each card, think of the answer, and then check the back to see if you are an e-safety expert like Kit the Fox!

What is personal information?

Information that can identify you, such as your full name, home address, school name, or telephone number.

Why should you keep your password secret?

To stop other people from accessing your accounts, changing your settings, or pretending to be you.

What is a 'digital footprint'?

The trail of information you leave behind when you use the internet, including websites visited and things you have posted.

What should you do if you see something online that makes you feel worried or uncomfortable?

Close the screen, stay calm, and tell a trusted adult immediately.

What does 'privacy settings' mean?

Tools on websites or apps that allow you to control who can see your profile and what information you share.

True or False: Everything you read on the internet is always 100% true.

False. You should always check if the website is trustworthy.

How should you treat others when playing games or chatting online?

Always be kind and respectful, just as you would be in person.

What is the 'Report' button used for?

It is used to alert website owners or moderators about content that is unkind, inappropriate, or breaks the rules.

Who is a 'trusted adult' you can talk to about internet safety?

Someone like a parent, carer, or teacher who will listen to your concerns and help you stay safe.

Why is it important to ask permission before downloading a file or app?

To make sure the software is safe and does not contain viruses or inappropriate content.
