4. What should a strong, secure password look like? A) A mix of letters, numbers, and symbols, B) Your own name, C) 123456, D) Your pet's name. (Answer: A*) (1 mark)

5. What is the secret code you use to keep your online accounts safe from others? (One word) (1 mark)

6. If someone is being mean to you in an online chat, what is the best thing to do? A) Reply with a meaner message, B) Block them and tell an adult, C) Ignore it and keep playing, D) Delete your account. (Answer: B*) (1 mark)

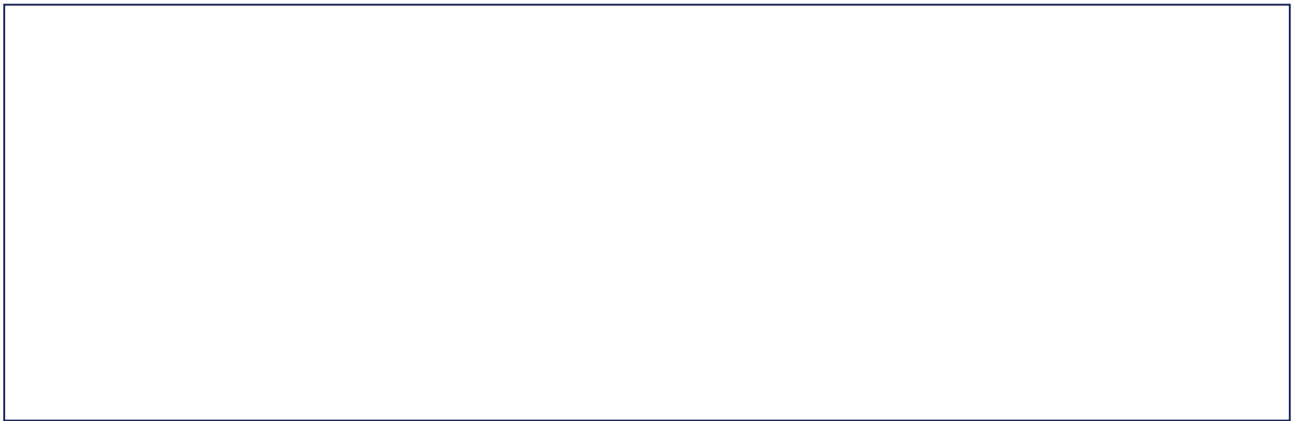
7. True or False: Once you post a photo or comment online, it can be very difficult to delete it forever. (1 mark)

10. 10. True or False: Being a kind digital citizen means treating people online with the same respect you would show them in the classroom. (1 mark)
