2. The _____ is a summary of what happens in the story, without giving away the ending! (1 mark)

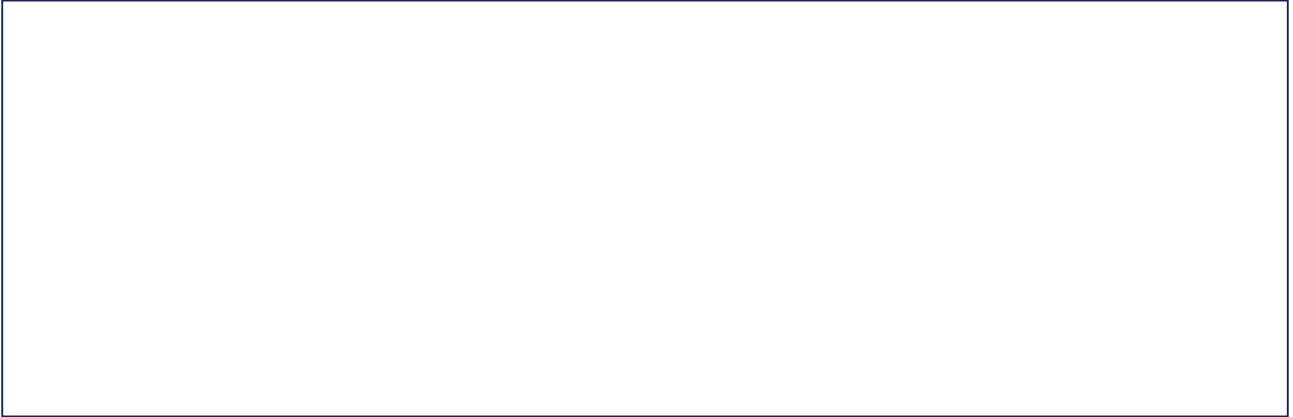
3. When you describe the people or animals in the story, you are talking about the _____. (1 mark)
